The researcher was successful in creating a fully functioning AI model that is able to predict Alzheimer's disease with an accuracy of 99.52% in an MRI scan of the brain. An operational API was also developed that allows users to interact with the system, allowing MRI images of the brain to be uploaded and processed through the AI model to determine the findings. with an average time of 2.2 seconds per MRI scan.

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
