Recently, thousands of universities have been established worldwide. They even face a higher risk of unemployment compared to those with only basic education. In China, youth unemployment rate is around 15%. Regarding the OECD, in 2020 the average dropout rate among member countries was about 32%, the US, Spain around 30%; Brazil, Colombia, Italy up to 50%. In Vietnam, 10-12% of students drop out or switch majors after two years; some colleges even up to 30%. Many reasons explain for college graduates' unemployment, one key factor is the choice of university and major. Many students drop out due to financial, academic struggles, or choosing unsuitable career. Selecting the right major is vital as it affects academic performance, career paths and the future life.
