Currently in the United States, there is a growing homeless population. In many cases these homeless / displaced individuals don't have any identifying cards that can provide quick to find information on the individual. It's not uncommon when a homeless person is taken to the hospital, it takes the hospital or emergency service staff a lot of time to identify who the homeless or displaced individual is. In many cases, this homeless person will be identified with a name such as 'John or Jane Doe' until proper identifying information can be obtained.
